John	Yes, Monty.
Monty	I've been [sitting there] watching you and I'm so worried you look so perplexed.
(Laughter	from sitters)
John	No, no I tend to drift, myself, slightly, at seances, so, [I'm in] a meditative mode, actually, Monty.
Monty	Well, have you got anything on your mind?
John	No; except that I've been thinking about you and indeed as has Veronica, and I'm sure that if you have anything for me to pass on to Veronica, I'd be delighted to
Monty	Well, of course I have! You know me. [It would be] so silly of me to come through, wouldn't it, and not speak to you.
(Laughter)	
John	I'm very pleased that you have. I'm delighted you have come through?
Monty	Well to tell you the truth, John, it's much different to what I expected.
Sitters	Ah, really!
Monty	Yes. It's good. Don't get me wrong, but different to what I expected.
John	Do you find that you can do more from that side than from this side?
Monty	Oh, so much more. So much more … yes … yes … yes. Would you pass something to Veronica for me?
John	Yes, yes, I will indeed.
Monty	You know that … that er … crystal that she has round her neck?
John	Yes.
Monty	It is like an epitaph to me, isn't it?
John	Ah hah, right, yes.
Monty	Well, could you tell her to stop wearing it. To be quite honest, It's like having I know it means a lot to her. But just tell her that I'm looking after her, and she doesn't need something like that to remember me.

John	Right, yes.
Monty	I'm there always, you see.
John	Yes. I understand how the communications from you have come through various mediums from different quarters.
Monty	Well. Some of them have. No. I'll tell you something, shall I. Some of them have been incorrect.
John	Ah hah.
Monty	But that young lady … that Melanie Polley.
John	Yes.
Monty	So good. Very, very good.
John	Right, yes, I know, I know. I've met her briefly and, I believe, another lady called Linda Williamson.
Monty	Oh, yes. She, she, she's good, as well. I met her a few times.
John	Ah hah.
Monty	But, of course, there are some that are just are jumping on the bandwagon, you see.
John	Yes, yes.
Monty	You have to watch for that because it's not all true!
John	Absolutely right. Have you encountered Professor Ellison while you've been across?
Monty	Ah, Ellison yes, of course. Well he only had two things to say to me and I to him, and er so He said, "Shall I tell you something" he said this. Had he known what he knows now when he was here he would have been courageous facing the SPR elite.
John	Ah, I see. Have you bumped into Ralph Noyes, at all, because he was an interesting man?
Monty	Ralph Noyes. Well, let me tell you something. I haven't had much to do with many of them, over there.
John	Right.
Monty	[inaudible] known, John!
John	(laughter) Yes.
Monty	I was always here and there people were always in my mind but it didn't mean to say that I always had contact with them. How many messages did you leave with me and I took an infinite time to get back to you.
John	(chuckle) We're thinking that perhaps you're doing your own version, Monty, as you would, because you were so meticulous that, er you might be doing your version of the cross-correspondences.
Monty	Well, yes, I am, to a degree … [5 second pause] … you see, it's difficult to speak … especially when … so much is known about me … and my work.
John	Yes, yes.
Monty	You have to be so careful. So I'm trying to think of things that I can say to you … but … you can check, you see.
John	Yes.
Monty	Oh, I understand that you have Playfair. Guy Playfair with you recently.
John	Yes, indeed. Guy came down and gave a talk at my open forum and very interesting it was, to.
Monty	Yes … he's a nice fellow, isn't he!

John	Yes, indeed. Do you have anything I'm sure Guy would be would be delighted if there was any message you'd like to pass on, of a personal nature or an evidential nature, for him.
Monty	You know, he was there when I came through to speak for my Day of Memory.
John	Ah, yes, yes.
Monty	But I gave him some evidence, then … regarding these … er … Enfield Investigations.
John	Ah, yes.
Monty	Information that wasn't known.
John	Er hum. Right.
Monty	Yes [Ask him] about that.
John	Oh, I shall.
Monty	Also, would you pass on to the fellow that, er … would you pass on to him … could he … be a little bit more meticulous in his endeavours with the psychic.
John	A little bit more meticulous with his endeavours with psychics. Right, yes.
Monty	I hope that you know it without saying any names. You understand who I'm talking about.
John	Yes
Monty	I know that he's particularly good friends with one. You know that, don't you?
John	I'm not sure which one you would mean there, Monty. I know he's in touch with a few but I'm not quite sure who they are.

John	Yes, yes, yes.

John	Yes are you talking about mind, er in a kind of general sense or mind from this side or from your side or from both?
Monty	Er, from both, you see, because they both blend together.
John	Hmm
Monty	Now John !
John	Yes?
Monty	I understand in the past, you tried to get this young man in the cabinet to do a talk.
John	Yes, that is true, but er the young man in the cabinet can sometimes be quite illusive, although he's very busy.

Monty	Well, I'll tell you something, shall I? He's finishing work at the end of this month. [inaudible comment] Now you know that I came to one of these seances and wrote the paper, didn't you?	
John	Yes.	
Monty	Well, of course, I still take an active interest … and I'll tell you something, shall I, John?	
John	Yes.	
Monty	I'll tell you something. You know me that I don't say anything lightly.	
John	No, indeed. You're very, very [fastidious].	
Monty	This boy is the real McCoy!	
John	Erm	
Monty	And I can tell you that.	
John	Yes, I'm sure.	
Monty	Nothing gets past me without me knowing. You know that, don't you?	
John	No! (laughter) and thank you very much for that, Monty.	
Monty	Well, please tell Veronica … I'm with her all the time … well, as much as I can be … and, and that I love her very much.	
John	I will indeed, Monty. Thank you for coming.	
Monty	And thank you, er Paul, for allowing me to come.	
Paul	Oh, it's our pleasure, isn't it. [inaudible] you know we we're going to have a guest and, er as the guest couldn't make it, is there anything you'd like to say?

Paul	Without naming names.	
Monty	[inaudible] I was going to speak to John about it.	
Paul	OK	
Monty	I didn't want to … to, to, to, to, to … to name any names, you see.	
Paul	No, thank you for that.

Paul	OK. Is there anything you'd like to pass on?
